Notable Investigations

- **20191020980 (Assault)** – On July 12th, police responded to an assault complaint at Acadia University which involved members of a youth leadership camp from across Canada. One of the males in attendance was consuming alcohol and became agitated by another member of the group wherein he choked the female victim. The male was subsequently arrested for assault and release on PTA&UTA.

- **20191317407 (Aggravated Assault)** – On August 30th, officers responded to a complaint of a male being stabbed. The dispute was in relation to a ex-boyfriend of a female being jealous of a new boyfriend. After stabbing the boyfriend multiple times, the ex-boyfriend made gestures and efforts at stabbing his ex-girlfriend as well. Upon arrival, the assailant was arrested and charged with Aggravated Assault and multiple other offences. He was led for court the following day.
- **20191356480 (Mischief – broken windows)** – On Sept. 6th, officers responded to a complaint of broken windows at the Baptist Church located on Main St in Wolfville. The subsequent investigation identified a young adult male as being responsible for the offence. This male has been identified but efforts to locate him have been of negative results thus far.
- **September 2019** - SCEU investigation into A MALE Break and Enter suspect (Jason SAUNDERS) residing in the Windsor area. SAUNDERS was suspected to be responsible for more than 25 commercial B&Es between Windsor and Kings District over the summer. SAUNDERS was confirmed to have an outstanding Canada-wide warrant for B&Es in BC. SAUNDERS was subsequently arrested and held for transport back to BC. All commercial B&E activity (consistent with SAUNDERS' MO) in the above named areas halted at this point.
- **Mid-September 2019** - Kings RCMP Transported a male back from Thunder Bay, ON for outstanding charges/warrants stemming from criminal investigations in Kings District. Transport was provided by RCMP Air Services.
