Other Notable Investigations

December 2016

911 call of a bleeding man walking on the road. Subject was on a curfew and on conditions not to consume alcohol. He was arrested, held for court and faced charges for breach of a court order.

January 2016

Cst. Kelli GAUDET, Kings District Community Policing Officer, delivered a presentation to approximately 50 Acadia University international students. Topics covered persons offences, impaired driving, alcohol consumption laws and road safety.

The Kings District domestic violence/sexual assault coordinator is leading an investigation into sexual assault, sexual interference and forcible confinement on a female minor in Wolfville. A 39 year old man was arrested and the matter is scheduled for trial in June.

February 2016

Kings District General Investigation Section is assisting in the investigation of an alleged unauthorized release of an intimate image. A former Wolfville resident reported seeing a naked photograph on a friend's computer. The investigation is ongoing.

Vehicle stopped while leaving a house party. Driver provided breath evidence, below the threshold of Criminal code impaired driving. Issued with several tickets and a roadside suspension.

Theft and illegal use of a debit card (multiple files). Subject identified, arrested and charged.

March 2016

Investigators responded to a harassment complaint that occurred at a Wolfville bar. A man was arrested and charged with a number of criminal offences, involving sexual and weapons offences. He was due back in court on March 21st, 2016 for plea.

Two separate incidents Vehicle stopped in Wolfville. Driver had been drinking. Breath evidence collected. Subject charged with impaired driving and compelled to court.

Complaint received of a vehicle stuck on the railroad tracks. Investigators attended, determined the driver had been drinking. Breath evidence provided. Driver charged with impaired driving.

Victim hit in the head with a thrown cue ball. Subject identified, arrested and compelled to court for assault with a weapon charges.

Investigators were called to a house by a neighbour who could hear arguing next door. Police arrested two subjects inside. One was released with a charge of breach of probation to follow and the other was arrested and held for breach of a recognizance before a Judge.

Street Crime Enforcement Unit

On February 8th, 2016, the Valley Integrated Street Crime Enforcement Unit and Kings District RCMP executed a search warrant at a Wolfville residence. Seized

were 160 grams of cocaine, scales, a cell phone, cash and a small amount of marijuana.

The 32 year old home owner was arrested and charged with possession of a controlled substance, and possession of a controlled substance for the purpose of trafficking.

School Safety Resource Officer

Cst. Alana SMITH is delivering a drug awareness presentation program to the Grade 5 class at Wolfville Elementary School. 5 presentations have been delivered, with an additional 2 left to deliver.

Additionally, on March 31st, she is scheduled to present to the after school program at Wolfville Children's Centre.
